- 5. Reports of Municipal Officers, Departments and Committees
- A. Mayor Report: Town Shop-Mayor Whitney reported he had started gathering the bids for the Town of Stockton shop. Mayor Whitney said he has received three bids for the structure and is getting bids for the electric, plumbing and the concrete.

Utah League of Cities and Towns is holding a Municipal Officials Training-February 06, 2016. Training is for new members and existing members. Fredda Root Town Clerk asked the council to let her know if they want to go as she will make sure the registration is taken care of. Town of Stockton will pay for the fees involved with the training for any members who are interested in attending.

- B. Report: Town Council: Mayor Whitney asked the new council members what their goal for Council was and what they wanted to do in the council. The new members Judy Bori and Thomas Karjola said that they wanted to learn from the Council and represent the town. Councilman Kendall Thomas gave out some information about the sandbar. Councilman Thomas read the first highlighted section (The Stockton Bar-To Preserve and Protect the Stockton Bar perhaps is the most important natural feature in the area. Well known as being the biggest and best preserved, wave-deposited sandbar in the Western Hemisphere, this unique feature attracts geology buffs and scientists. The sandbar is an important open space amenity, providing a place to hike and explore the unique geological feature and surrounding landscape. Over the years there have been several attempts to mine the bar, which would be an incalculable loss. Tooele County citizens and decision makers should remain vigilant to ensure this unique feature is preserved and protected.) Dave Durtschi read the second highlighted section. (City of Stockton The lack of adequate water resources and centralized sewer are key issues for this small community.) Councilman Karjola had two pages of questions for the council, Mayor Whitney told Councilman Karjola to call and make an appointment and Mayor Whitney would be more than happy to help answer all of his questions.
- C. Parks: Not much happening at the Stockton Park. Town of Stockton did get a grant for new LED Christmas lights. Town of Stockton is hoping to get a grant to build new solar panels to light the new Christmas Lights to be used on Main Street during the holiday season. Councilman Thomas Karjola wanted to know if the Mayors Park is being watered. Mayor Whitney explained the Mayors Park is on a drip system.
- D. Roads: David is doing a fantastic job with the snow removable. Mr. Wright plowed on Christmas day at 6:00 am. Mr. Wright has made sure all of the streets have been kept plowed and salted thru this stormy season. Mayor Whitney wanted to give Mr. Wright some extra recognition for his job.
- E. Garbage Report: David Wright does all of the garbage collection for the town of Stockton. Mr. Wright is repairing the broken trash cans; it will help with the cost of new trash cans.
- F. Police Report: Tooele County Sherriff gave his report and there is nothing going on in the town of Stockton. Tooele County Sherriff did report they had found a dead body in

Town of Stockton. Chief Johnson gave his report, things are doing well nothing exciting going on in Town, it has been kind of quiet.

- G. Fire Department: Justin Huffman gave his report for the fire Department. Justin Huffman is the new Chief/EMT and Johnathon Thatcher is the new Asst/Emt . Mayor Whitney congratulated Mr. Huffman on being elected the new fire chief. Town of Stockton Fire Department has three people in EMT class. Town of Stockton's Volunteer Fire Department just came back from winter fire school in St. George. School in St. George was financed by a grant. Town of Stockton's Fire Department wants to purchase a new tank for the new water truck they are building, the new tank price is about \$7,000.00.
- H. Water Department: Everything is freezing; we ran the well today since we don't have a lot of water coming down due to the freezing weather. Town of Stockton won the most improved water system award from Rural Water. This is a prestigious award since they only give one a year in all of Utah. Councilman Durtschi asked about how we have being doing with our search for a water master system. Alissa Perez is the backup for the water master. Mayor Whitney is going to talk to Gary Hunter about becoming the Town of Stockton water master. Councilman Durtschi wanted to know how the search for the Sand for the water filtering system was coming. Parsons has agreed to do a special run for us in the spring. So we will be able to get the sand we need in the spring.
 - 1. Sewer: Everything is flowing well, running down hill ponds are froze over but the water keeps feeding the ponds.

 Public Hearing (TBD) Sterling Codifiers have asked Town of Stockton to have a
 public hearing soon about the changes to the codifications. Mayor Whitney will bring Town
 Council members a copy of the changes.
