### 10. Department Reports

A. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney

- Chief asks Officer Young to stand. On April 14<sup>th</sup> Officer Young, along with the Fire Department responded to an unconscious male on Silver Ave. When he arrived, the man had no pulse and no heartbeat. Officer Young then performed CPR, at which point, the Fire Department arrived and assisted, and was able to get the male to have a pulse, as well as increasing his blood pressure. With that being said, the Town would like to thank and recognize Officer Young for performing amazing lifesaving efforts. Chief Romney presented Officer Young a Certificate of recognition.

- 1. Number of Traffic Stops: 30
- 2. Number of Tickets Issued: 13, before was 17, but 4 of them were fix it Tickets.

3. Number of Arrests/ Citations in lieu of: 07 the arrests were for Violation of Protective Order, Prescription forgery, arrested 3 individuals for Marijuana and Drug Paraphernalia, and had distribution of controlled substance, and one Methamphetamine, Percocets and Marijuana. There were no use of force incidents.

- 4. Number of Cases: 37
- 5. Number of Impounds: 02
- 6. Number of Call outs: 05

- Had a juvenile male bringing in 1oz. of marijuana into town every three days. He would then package it and deal it to other kids in town ages 8 years old to 17 years old. A Search Warrant was secured and executed. He was then charged with a Felony and Misdemeanors.

- An adult female Stockton resident stole a prescription pad from a doctor's office and was writing fake prescriptions and trying to use them in pharmacies in Tooele. We worked with Tooele City Detective to arrest and charge her.

- Stopped an adult female for speeding, during the stop we located Methamphetamine, Marijuana, and 136 Percocets that we believe she was selling, but weren't able to prove. She was charged with possession.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

- Assistant Chief Thatcher: Had 17 calls, 6 of those were in Town, 8 Medicals, 5 Rescues, 2 Fires, and 2 training.

-David Nutzman wants to thank Chief Romney and Assistant Chief Thatcher for such a great response on a side by side role over accident near Jacob City. The folks that were involved in the accident were friends of David's; he says the response could not have been better.

#### c. Recreation (Parks)

-Stockton Days will be scaled back quite a bit. We just went through the budget and we're hurting. The Mayor says we're going to have to raise taxes. We are still going to do

something for Stockton Days, but it's not going to be like anything we've had these past few years. We're hoping a lot of the community will still show up!
