For September 2018 there were 7 total details. 1 significant incident. September 26<sup>th</sup> 2018, Deputy responded to a residential burglary on Rogers Street. The victim stated jewelry and cash was stolen from the bedroom. No suspects were identified and there was no forced entry into the house. The case was referred to Chief Romney.

## 6. Department Reports

### a. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney-See attached

Last month we had 40 traffic stops, 43 cases, and 8 call outs.

Enforcement activity- 3 warrants/ traffic offenses, 2 outstanding suspects in our copper theft, 1 domestic violence, 1 possession of heroin, and 1 possession and distribution of a controlled substance. There were no use of force incidents.

Major crimes- 1. We located and apprehended the last two suspects involved in the copper theft at the gravel pit. They confessed and were taken into custody without incident. 2. Arrested a Stockton resident for possession of a controlled substance, subsequent investigation revealed that she was dealing the substance to several people.

Nuisances- Water/sewer has been shut off at a residence in town due to lack of payment and violation of Town Ordinance.

Community events- Nightmare on Connor was a success. It went from 1730-2000. The Police Department almost ran out of doughnuts and the Fire Departments almost ran out of candy.

Thank you to Mayor Karjola and Councilwoman Nash for coming by and supporting us.

The 2018 Shop with a Cop will be kicking off this month, on November 12<sup>th</sup>, applications will be available at the Town Hall. Tip a Cop will be happening at Casa Del Ray in Grantsville on December 4th, and Jims in Tooele County on December 6<sup>th</sup>. The Shop with a Cop event will be on December 15th 2018.

### b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

Last month we had 14 calls, 2 rescues, 9 medicals, and 3 fires. We had 4 people in ADO Pumper course that took 3-4 months and completed that course. We were able to acquire a 100kw generator. We now have a backup generator if the generator goes out up at the well. Assistant Chief Thatcher did Nightmare on Connor with Chief Romney on Halloween. The Army Depot just got rid of one of their trucks; we won't be able to acquire it for free but Chief Huffman will look into that more and see how much it will cost. If we can pick it up for a decent price the Fire Department would like to look into getting that. For the fall/winter reminder for the public we will be putting a flyer in with the water bills reminding people about the fire hazards and reminding everyone to keep their spaces clean while we have snow on the ground.
