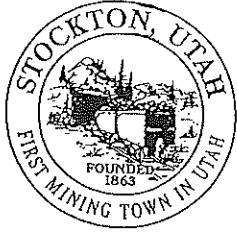

7. Department Reports

a. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney-See attached

Last month we had 17 traffic stops, 34 calls, 09 call outs and 02 County assists.

Use of force- 1. On October 23, 2019 Stockton officers responded to a report of domestic in progress at the Veterans Memorial Park. Upon arrival the male in the incident began walking away from officers. Stockton Police were forced to stop the male using control holds and wrestling him down on the ground. Use of force report was filed with the incident and was found to be within policy. 2. On October 17, 2019 Stockton officers along with Tooele City officers made entry into a motor home on Sherman Ave. The resident of the motor home was using methamphetamine as officers made entry. He refused to show his hands, and comply with commands. The suspect was brought out at gun point. Use of force report was filed with the incident and was found to be within policy.

Major crimes- 1. Two narcotic cases involving methamphetamine and heroin. One case involved the search of a motor home, and discovery of stolen checks and debit cards. 2. Two traffic/warrant arrests. 3. Two domestic violence. 4. One public intoxication and disorderly. 5. One fatal car accident.

Nuisances- 1. Working with Mayor Karjola and the Town Clerk on the manufactured home on Sheridan Street. We are preparing to write an administrative warrant. 2. Stockton Police Department has been working with Stockton's Town Attorney Roger Baker, on writing and improving some of our nuisance laws.

Community oriented policing- 1. The annual 'Guns and Hoses' trick or treat was a huge success. We had several families stop by. We ran out of doughnuts and most of the candy. 2. Shop with a Cop season is here. Applications are available at the Town Hall. Please spread the word if you know of families in need of help for the holidays.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

Last month we had 18 calls. 3 in Town, 15 out of Town. The Fire Department has 3 people in advanced Wild Land courses. Libby Bowden took her in class practical's and finished top of her class. Mayor Karjola and Fire Chief Justin Huffman have been working hard on getting some funding from the County. Next week is the Elections for the Fire Department, but doesn't plan on any movement happening. The Fire Department will be doing a lot of work on the trucks this winter.




