a. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney

Last month we had 41 traffic stops, 38 calls, 14 call outs and 02 County assists.

Use of force incidents- 1. 20S000241 Woman having a psychiatric break, needed to be restrained until medical arrived.

Major crimes- 1. Two domestic violence. 2. One threat. 3. Four traffic/ warrants. 4. Four ATV accidents. 4. One accidental gun shot.

Ordinances- The Police Department is starting to keep eye on the weed issues, the length and how high they get. We are working with our Town Attorney to start the process on enforcing the cleaning of some of our troubled areas.

Community oriented policing- 1. Officer Dan Chamberlain left for a full-time position in Grantsville. Officer Connor Curtis will be leaving for a full-time position with the Toole County Sheriff's Office. Both express their love and gratitude for Stockton and the experience they received. Both said they are remorseful to leave but are bettering themselves. We wish them well and good luck. We thank them for their service to the community. 2. Liberty Yates, an officer with almost two decades of experience in patrol, investigations and AP&P will be starting with us on Tuesday July 14, 2020. She also teaches Law Enforcement at Stansbury High School and Tooele High School. The Stockton Police Department is lucky to have her. 3. Micheal Canon has submitted all his paperwork for the Police Academy and should be ready to go by the start of the academy.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

The Fourth of July went really well for the Fire Department. The Fire Department has been really busy with it being fire season. The County has started to adopt a weed ordinance they have been modifying. The Fire Department would like to follow the County's ordinance as much as possible. They are also adopting Fire Regulations for fire sprinklers and buildings in Tooele County.


