Last month we had 41 calls, 21 traffic stops, 8 arrests, 62 dedicated patrol and 2 County assists. It was a busy month for the Police Department. The Shop With A Cop is December 20, 2020. It will be a little different this year because of Covid-19. The Police Officers will not be able to take the kids shopping this year. Because of that, the Police Officers will be shopping for the kids at Walmart starting at 5:30am. The Police Officers will deliver the packages and gifts to each family's front porch and stepping back at an appropriate distance and allowing the families and children to come out and see the Police cars and interact with the Police Officers.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

Last month we had 12 calls, 3 in Town. The engine was taken in for a pump test, they called back and said that there is several fixes that needs to be made to the engine. The pump test cannot be complete until the repairs are done. The tank of the five ton is being mounted and painted. The County is helping with the tank and the plumbing on the truck. The Fire Department is hoping to have the truck running soon. The Fire Department is working on the feasibility study and will be holding a meeting the third week of January to make a decision on the feasibility study. First Responders are going to be getting the vaccines for Covid-19 the first week of January.


