- a. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney
Last month we had a total of 76 calls. 1 alarm, 6 animal control, 2 child abuse, 1 custodial

interference, 8 drugs, 3 follow up, 1 fraud, 2 intoxicated person, 3 juvenile problem, 6 medical assist, 1 prowler, 1 sex offenses, 2 suicide/psychiatric, 7 suspicious, 3 traffic accidents, 6 traffic offenses, 2 trespassing, 2 vagrant, 6 VIN inspection, 4 wanted person/fugitive, 2 welfare check, 1 911 hang us, 1 civil standbys, 3 citizen assists, 122 dedicated patrol, 69 traffic stops.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

Last month we had a total of 17 calls. 7 fires, 7 medicals and 3 rescues.

Its open burn season, you can get a permit through Tooele County and get an open burn permit. The Fire Department is working with Union Pacific Railroad in hopes to getting a training course on how to fight fires on the railroad systems, or hazardous responses on the rails.

Chief Huffman found SCBA bottles that have 9 years left for \$550 a bottle.

c. Recreation (Parks)

We've had some graffiti and vandalism up at the ball park. The Town will be looking into getting security cameras. These cameras might need to be budgeted for next year.




