5. Department Reports

a. Stockton Police Department-Chief Romney

Last month we had a total of 41 calls. 5 agency assists, 3 animal control, 2 background checks, 1 death investigation, 3 drugs, 3 domestic violence, 2 follow up, 2 fraud, 1 homicide, 2 nuisance, 1 sex offense, 1 suicide/psychiatric, 3 suspicious, 1 traffic accident, 2 traffic offenses, 1 wanted person/fugitive, 1 welfare check, 3 civil standbys, 3 citizen assists, 60 dedicated patrol, 31 traffic stops, 1 County assists.

July 4th weekend- Stopped 24 cars. Had a total of 11 calls, 2 were fire related a reported vehicle fire on Copper and a camp fire up dry canyon. The Police Department made 3 arrests: 1. A suspicious male behind the restaurant after closing, had a felony warrant for burglary. 2. A male at a BBQ was drunk and disorderly on South Sheridan. 3. Two males were talking down Copper near the park, intoxicated at 1:00am. After speaking to them, 11 grams of marijuana was discovered on their person as well as a fully loaded handgun.

b. Stockton Fire Department-Chief Huffman/Assistant Chief Thatcher

Last month we had 11 calls. There were no fire calls last month. Fire restrictions are in place. The Fire Department is very proud of the residents for following directions with fireworks being banned. The Morgan Canyon fire is still burning. The Fire Department had 5 new people join the Fire Department and going through basic training.

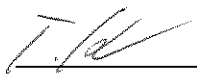

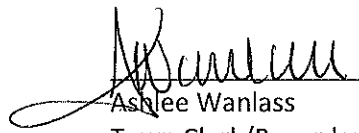
